One of my favorite things about coordinating the Christmas Baskets Program is setting up adoptions for families.

For those who don't know, anyone who wants to adopt a family for Christmas can do so through Dove and Northeast by calling me. You can tell me how big of a family you'd like to adopt – say a mother and two kids, or a family of six, or any other size of your choosing. This has been something a lot of individuals and small groups have done over the years. For instance, a group of employees at a certain work place, or a church group, or even a group of family and friends who want to bless someone for the season can choose to do so through adoption.

We only ask that you match what we do: the Christmas meal food-wise, hats and gloves for every member of the family, a gift for each child, stockings, etc. You're always welcome to go over and beyond those guidelines, and people who adopt families generally do. After you've collected all your Christmas treasures for your adopted families, you get to deliver directly to them, which most people find both fun and rewarding.

If you or your group want more specific information on how the process works, I'd be happy to speak with you in person, on the phone, or even through email – whatever works best for you.

I've witnessed some amazing Christmas adoptions over the years. Three years ago, I received a call from a church who wanted to adopt a family. The family that I linked them with had lost their home in a recent house fire. The entire church pitched in and gave them a Christmas to remember which included buying them a brand-new refrigerator for their new place!

The following year I had a fellow staff member tell me about a domestic violence client who had really been hit hard economically the last few months and let me know that her family could benefit from being adopted. I was sad to tell her that at that point I didn't have anyone else who was wanting to adopt a family. She went back to her office and within ten minutes I had a phone call from a group who wanted to adopt a family with the exact number of family members that my co-worker was telling me about! God works in mysterious and amazing ways.

Last year, a former Dove staff member adopted a family that had multiple children. The mom was working but struggling to get there every day without reliable transportation. In addition to all of the other things this former Dove staff collected for them for Christmas, she gave them her car for the woman to be able to continue working!

I fully believe some of the things I've been witness to at Christmas have been miracles. I hope you and your family or friends might consider being a miracle to someone this year.

- 1. Wrapping Paper (Partial rolls are okay)
- 2. Gift bags of all sizes and colors (don't have to be Christmas oriented)
- 3. Ziploc Bags largest size
- 4. Items for babies and toddlers
- 5. Stockings
- 6. Hats and gloves
