

#### Letter from the Executive Director of Dove, Inc.: Coordinating Efforts to Address Unmet Needs and Social Injustices.

Dear Friends,

One of Dove, Inc.'s program areas provides services to the Homeless population of Macon County. A common myth exists about the homelessness issues occurring in our community. "We are such a generous community that people come here for our services." "People come to Decatur and bring their problems with them." Or some variation therein.

Our local Continuum of Care to End Homelessness has been working with clients and seeing some significant successes in helping individuals and families to obtain and maintain housing in recent years. Our known chronically homeless population is down to the

single digits. Our veteran's homelessness is at functional zero, meaning if we find them we can house them typically within a day. Of course, we still struggle alongside some challenging clients with addictions and criminal histories and similar barriers, but we are making headway every day. Yet, we still hear on a regular basis about people who "come to Decatur."

To combat this common misperception, I would like to provide some data from our Continuum Management Information System (also known as HMIS). This system used by agencies and organizations across Macon County is used to document services provided. Among other information we collect, the zip code where a person last had a permanent address prior to becoming homeless is recorded. Of the 1354 individuals provided housing services for homeless or formerly homeless in the last year 1248 or 92.2% had homes in Decatur and became homeless here. Another 25 came from surrounding communities in Macon, DeWitt, and Shelby Counties. 1 family came from Arkansas, and 2 from Chicago. In our chronically homeless population we had some who had been homeless long enough that they could not recall their last address. Still, all told just 7% of the Homeless and formerly Homeless population seeking services could not trace their last known address to Decatur.


None of us like to think of this happening to our friends and our neighbors, so of course it is tempting to hold onto the myth of transient homelessness. However, our community needs understand that this is a homegrown problem, and it will take homegrown solutions to turn things around. This is our home, these are our people, this is our problem.

The next Homeless Advisory Council meeting will be September 13, 1:30 p.m. at 788 East Clay. We will be discussing National Hunger and Homelessness Awareness Week plans and agency services updates. These bimonthly meetings are open to anyone interested in working on solutions and ending homelessness in Decatur and Macon County. Dove, Inc. is only as strong as its member organizations, volunteers, and advocates. Thank you for working to make our home a community of neighbors with hope for anyone in need.

## 2018 Christmas Baskets

With Fall rapidly approaching, those of us at Dove and Northeast Community Fund have begun the initial stages of preparing for our joint Christmas Baskets Program. It probably seems early to most people, but there's a lot of work to be done before Baskets week arrives! An initial email has gone out to the other agencies that we work with and provide basket referrals, to confirm they're going to participate this year. Flyers and informational handouts are getting a fresh look this year, the request for donation letter is being re-written, donations are already being collected at both agencies.

There will be a lot more information coming out in the next few months as Christmas draws closer, but for now, here are some facts and dates to think about. Last year:

• We served 335 families with baskets, which equaled 1373 individuals being assisted

• 14 families were adopted out by other individuals or groups

• 48 volunteers completed 288.75 hours of work during baskets week

This year, we will need donations of:

• Toys and gifts (for ages infant – 17 years old, unwrapped, new and unused)

• Stocking stuffers (candy, Goldfish snacks, little toys and games)

• Wrapping paper (partial rolls are a-okay!) & rolls of Scotch tape

• Gift bags (all sizes)

• Hygiene supplies (shampoo, deodorant, soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, floss, etc. – all new please)

- Books (new, for any and all ages)
- Big, heavy duty black garbage bags
