





The Purple Lights Tree is in Recognition of those who are working for a safer life without domestic violence and to those who have lost their lives.


The Red Lights Tree in Honor of those working to find safe homes for themselves and their families and to those who have lost their lives due to homelessness issues.

- Driver's License or other Photo I.D. and copy of current Ameren Illinois utility bill
- Applicant must reside at the address on the bill and have active service in his or her name
- Income eligibility, see guidelines, above
- Applicant can receive WNCF assistance only once per heating season, which is 9/1 to 5/31 each year and once per cooling season, 6/1 to 8/31
- WNCF matches customer payments (within the last 45 days) up to \$350 during heating season and up to \$200 during cooling season
- Heating grants are based solely on income guide-lines while cooling grants are intended for seniors, disabled or those with medical conditions exacerbated by heat (with a doctor's letter)

#### **News from Homeward Bound**

Staff have been working to engage and house 24 individuals who have been literally homeless (in a shelter, on the streets or somewhere unfit for human occupancy, such as an abandoned building) for 90-days or more. 5 of those individuals meet the chronically homeless criteria, which means they have a diagnosable disability AND have been homeless for at least 1 year or have been homeless 4 times in the past 3 years, totaling 365 days.

There are 708 total participants currently receiving housing and/or services.

The need for 1-bedroom units for single individuals is still dire!

It feels like time goes faster the older I get. I know that's not how things work; time, after all, is a universal invariant. But it certainly seems to be the case. It feels like we just wrapped up Christmas Care & Share 2021 a few days ago! As much work as it is to coordinate a program that's gotten as large as it has (last year we served 836 families, 2,486 children receiving toys), I truly love the program and being able to serve people at Christmas.

For those who don't know, we partner not only with Northeast Community Fund for this program, but also Toys for Tots and Salvation Army. We give referrals to surrounding schools and agencies such as Anna Waters Head Start Program, Baby

Talk, Heritage Behavioral Health Center, Macon County Health Department, and many, many others. Each family who receives gifts is only served once – and we cross reference all referrals to make sure of this – in order to serve as many families and children as possible who are in need.

We obviously couldn't serve so many people if it weren't for all the many volunteers and donors who make sure we have what we need to accomplish the project. We appreciate every single one of you!

This year, we need donations of hats and gloves in all sizes for kids ages 0 - 17, as well as toys and gifts for that age range.

We're also planning to serve between 70 – 75 seniors in nursing homes with gift baskets. If you would like to donate gifts for a senior, or even adopt one of our seniors for Christmas and provide them with a gift basket, please reach out to Angie at 217.428.6616 until November 30. After that you can call or text her at 217.655.5213, as she will be out of the office and working out of St. Paul's Lutheran Church until the end of Christmas Care & Share. The same information applies if you are interested in adopting a whole family for Christmas!

Volunteers are needed to help during the toy distribution between Tuesday, December 13 – Friday, December 16, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Opportunities include helping to run a toy/gift station. This can be a seated or standing job and will be mostly to let the parents who are shopping know how many gifts they can get for each of their children off the table you're overseeing. The other opportunity involves more standing and walking around with parents to help guide them through the distribution center and assist them in picking out gifts.

There is a short, required training for both volunteer positions. Those training dates are Friday, December 2, 10:00 to 11:00 a.m.

This year's theme is Celebrate Life, Live Drug Free. While at one of the presentations an adult came up to us and shared that she was so glad we were there! There was at least one child she was aware of whose family home was going through specifically the issues we had just addressed in our presentation. She said it was a timely message and gave her chills.

Last week has been prep time for the Halloween night Trunk or Treat Party with Torrence Park. This event was full of fun and a festive night of costumes, treats and games!



As the calendar flips from October to November the purple signs and purple ribbons begin to be removed and stored away for next October's observance of Domestic Violence Awareness Month. So, the problem is over, right? No, not at all. Domestic violence continues to plague society every day of every month of every year. Approximately 15% of all cases in our legal system are domestic violence related. A woman is beaten every nine seconds. Worldwide, 87,000 women are murdered each year; 58% of these women are killed at the hands of a family member or intimate partner. Every day, kids go to school hungry, sleep-deprived, and scared, unable to concentrate on classroom assignments. Each day the work goes on in shelters and offices all over the world to make a difference in the lives of victims and their families, to make their worlds a safer, happier place in which to live. Please continue to remember these victims and to celebrate those who have survived this issue and moved on with their lives. Continue to be aware of your surroundings and to report any suspicious activity you observe to the appropriate authorities. We pray that sometime in the future this problem can be eradicated, but in the present, we remain dedicated to the mission of a safe, healthy life for everyone.
