Christmas is a challenging time for many and when compounded with things such as health concerns, domestic violence, mental health, unemployment, housing insecurity, food insecurity and other factors, it is extra trying. We had more people signed up for Christmas assistance this year than ever before. Partnering with Northeast Community Fund, Salvation Army, St. Paul's Lutheran Church, and Toys for Tots enabled us to serve 1,231 families with toys for their children in 2023, which equaled 3,337 children receiving toys and gifts.

None of us could have pulled that off without the generosity of every single person who donated toys, wrapping paper and tape, hygiene items, money, stockings, hats and gloves, and the gift of your time for those who volunteered. We had 230 people who volunteered their time to help with Christmas Care & Share, who spent nearly 1,300 hours of time in the two weeks we were there. There are not enough words to express my sincere

gratitude to every single one of you, as well as every single person from Toys for Tots, the staff at Dove, Salvation Army, Northeast Community Fund and St. Paul's Lutheran Church who came and helped.

The counting and sorting of toys and items is time-consuming and sometimes tedious, but you answered the call. Helping man the toy stations and helping the families shop is another big job — and you answered that, too. Thank you.

Thank you to those who donated lunch for our staff and volunteers during distribution: Brandy Robinson (who served Namken Nutrition to us), Casey's, Olive Garden, El Corral and La Gondola.

A HUGE thank you goes out to everyone at St. Paul's Lutheran Church for being gracious and thoughtful hosts who went well above and beyond answering the call when it came to helping, preparing and passing out snacks and drinks for staff, volunteers, and people receiving gifts for their children throughout distribution week, and greeting and guiding people around the church to help them find their way. An extra big thanks to Mick who is always our point of contact from St. Paul's and who helps us get set up and organized, many times going as far as to help unload and haul donations around to get them where they needed to go.

I would be remiss not to mention Pawprint Ministries for bringing several of their comfort dogs through to mingle with staff and individuals who were there during distribution week. It was a huge success. Thank you to all of you for your kind spirit and generosity! I wish I could mention every single person who helped and donated but there are so many people, and I don't want to forget anyone so please know we appreciate you!

I also want to thank our Care & Share Committee for all their hard work going all the way back to March of 2023 when we began planning and organizing things. You are all amazing and we could not have pulled things off without you. I thank God for you all every day.

Always thanks to our partners: Northeast Community Fund, St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Salvation Army, and Toys for Tots.

My heart is full the way it is every year when the community turns out and goes beyond themselves to serve those who are most in need in Central Illinois at Christmas time. Bless you all.

The holiday season is a very busy time of the year and can bring joy to people. But for some people the holiday season brings challenges and stressors. Domestic violence during the holidays is a serious problem, and the holiday season should be a joyful time for most, the domestic violence rates increase and surge during this time of the year.

One of the most significant contributors to the rise in domestic violence during the holidays is financial stress. The pressure to buy gifts, host gatherings, and meet societal expectations can strain household budgets. This financial burden often exacerbates existing tensions within relationships, making it a trigger for violent behavior. The holidays can also be emotionally taxing. The expectation to maintain a cheerful demeanor, coupled with the stress of family interactions, can lead to heightened emotions. For those already in volatile relationships, these emotional triggers can escalate conflicts into physical violence. The holiday season is often accompanied by increased alcohol consumption, which is a well-known risk factor for domestic violence. Alcohol can impair judgment and lower inhibitions, making it easier for underlying tensions to erupt into physical confrontations. Family

gatherings can sometimes act as a catalyst for domestic violence. The presence of extended family can either inhibit or provoke violent behavior. In some cases, family members may even normalize or trivialize the abuse, making it difficult for victims to speak out. The societal emphasis on family and togetherness during the holidays can also be a contributing factor. Victims may be more reluctant to leave or report their abusers during this time, fearing they'll ruin the holidays for their children and others with whom they normally observe the holidays.

My question is, how can you help as an individual?

You can help survivors of domestic violence by connecting them with resources or supporting a local nonprofit that provides related services.

You can do this by:

- Making a donation
- Volunteering your time
- Donating "Wish List" items
- Joining a committee

Lastly, starting off in the year 2024, I would like to thank all that have donated their time, food to the food pantry, or a financial donation to Dove Inc. in DeWitt County. It's greatly appreciated!





Happy New Year, I can't believe it is 2024! I'm not quite sure where 2023 went, as it went very fast and now it's time to reach for the stars in the new year! I feel that in order to help renew goals and objectives it's helpful to reflect on the past, so I did just that, and WOW we were able to help many households over the past year! In 2023, DFA was able to assist 516 households throughout Macon, DeWitt, Piatt, Moultrie, and Shelby Counties. These 516 households were only able to be assisted because of donations given by individuals and churches! What we do for these communities isn't possible without each and every one of you, whether it's through your financial giving, sharing of information to those in need, or your prayers! We were also awarded a grant to assist seniors in Macon County that was able to help 65 households. Through the Warm Neighbors Cool Friends Program we were able to assist 107 households, which wouldn't have been possible without the Energy Assistance Foundation.

For 2024, I would love to see the number of households that we are able to assist increase. This goal isn't because I want to see more people struggling, it's because I know the hardships that are in the community, and I want more people to know of our services and for us to be able to approve more applications. This goal can't be attained without all of you though!

What I would ask of each of you reading this is to:

- •Share the information about DFA with others so they can either seek help or donate
- •Share the information about Warm Neighbors Cool Friends with others so they can apply
- •Donate to DFA as you are able
- Pray for the work DFA is doing and for those that are seeking assistance
- •Share this information with your small group, or better yet, schedule a time for me to come speak to your group
- •Reach out with interest to join an Advisory Committee for DFA or share this opportunity with someone you think would be a good fit

If everyone could do some or all of the above, then 2024 will be the best year yet for DFA and we will have our biggest outreach to those experiencing hardships! I have a sign hanging in my office that I want to be my reminder for 2024. It says, "To the world you may be just one person, but to one person you may be the world." When people come and ask for assistance, which isn't always easy, it can totally change their lives when we can stop the downward financial spiral and help them get back on their feet. Will you help me with the goal of DFA reaching more people this year? I hope you will!

2023/24 Warm Neighbors Cool Friends Income Requirements & Energy Bill Payment Assistance Guidelines

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION TO APPLY:

- Driver's License or other Photo LD.
- Copy of current Ameren linois energy bit
- Proof of Income



PROGRAM RULES:

- Applicant(s) must reside at address on bill and have active service in their name
- Applicant can only receive assistance
 ONCE per heating season (January
 1 May 31) and ONCE in the cooling season (June 1 August 30)
- •Account balance must be lower than \$1,500
- •WNCF pledges up to \$500 during heating season matching customer payments within the last 45 days
- •Cooling season maximums are \$200 and are intended for seniors, disabled, or those with medical conditions exacerbated by heat (with a doctor's letter)
- •30 Day (GROŚS) Income Range by Family Size


