In wrapping up this school year I wanted to take time to reflect on the importance of Beginning Awareness Basic Education Studies (BABES) program to the children in our community.

From the National Center for Drug Abuse Statistics

- 1-in-10 Americans over the age of 12 have Alcohol Use Disorder
- Alcohol causes 13.5% of deaths 20 -39 years old
- Among 12-17 year olds, 4.9% abuse prescription drugs Every year, there are more than 4,000 alcohol-related deaths in individuals under the age of 21. This includes car accidents, homicides, alcohol poisoning and suicides. Adolescents who start drinking before the age of 15 are four times more likely to become alcohol dependent at some point in their lives.

The BABES program is a foundational start for students in making the right decisions, not succumbing to peer pressure, and knowing the adults in their life that they can talk to. With puppets and discussion with the children the BABES program reinforces what children have learned from parents, teachers, and law enforcement about the dangers of using alcohol and drugs.





At the Tuesday, February 21, 2023 Decatur City Council Meeting, the council approved "Resolution Approving Sub-Recipent Agreement with Dove, Inc. for Rent, Mortgage and Utility Assistance Utilizing CDBG-CV Funds."

Please watch for updates after receiving the final guidelines necessary.

Up to \$250,000 in funds could be distributed by DFA with a maximum of \$10,000 per approved household. This funding is for Decatur residents.

Covid Pre-Checklist

- O Do you live in the city of Decatur?
- Has your income been affected by Covid? This could include any of the following options:
 - You missed work because you or someone in your household had Covid
 - . You were in quarantine due to Covid and had to miss work
 - . Your place of employment closed due to Covid
 - · Your daycare or school shut down due to Covid
- Do you meet the Income Requirements? (see website doveinc.org)

If the answer was "YES" to all of the above, move on to the next questions.

- Have you received Covid assistance from the City of Decatur before. This could have been through either Dove, Decatur Township, or Salvation Army?
- O Do you or someone in your household have a conflict of interest between the City of Decatur or Dove, Inc.? This conflict of interest could include:

Being related to an employee, agent, consultant, officer or elected official or appointed official of the City or Dove, Inc., by birth, marriage or adoption and resides within the same household. This would refer specifically to members of the Neighborhood Services Division of the City of Decatur and DFA of Dove, Inc.

If the answer was "NO" to the above two questions, you can move on with getting an application. Applications are available at doveinc.org or a DFA location.

June 1 began the cooling guidelines that we must follow for Warm Neighbors Cool Friends through the Energy Assistance Foundation. All this information is on our website, and the matched amount for qualified applicants is up to \$200 from customer payments in the past 45 days. As well as income guidelines, you must either be a senior, disabled, or have a medical condition exacerbated by heat (with a doctor's letter). Feel free to reach out with any questions!

I was excited that this past month I was invited to come and speak at the Sullivan Ministerial Association. I was able to share about all that Dove is doing in Moultrie County, including how DFA can assist residents. I'm excited about the relationships that will begin to grow in that area so that we can come together to help as many people as possible in Moultrie County! Note: Families must show proof of income. A family's monthly gross income must fall between the below ranges, based upon family size, to qualify.

- Applicant can receive WNCF assistance only once per heating season, which is 9/1 to 5/31 each year and once per cooling season, 6/1 to 8/31
- WNCF matches customer payments (within the last 45 days) up to \$500 during heating season and up to \$200 during cooling season
- Heating grants are based solely on income guide-lines while cooling grants are intended for seniors, disabled or those with medical conditions exacerbated by heat (with a doctor's letter)

News from Homeward Bound

Staff have been working to engage and house 17 individuals who have been literally homeless (in a shelter, on the streets or somewhere unfit for human occupancy, such as an abandoned building) for 90-days or more. Three of those individuals meet the chronically homeless criteria, which means they have a diagnosable disability AND have been homeless for at least 1 year or have been homeless 4 times in the past 3 years, totaling 365 days.

There are total 189 participants currently receiving housing and/or services.

The need for 1-bedroom units for single individuals is still dire!
