Did you know that DFA, Dove Financial Assistance, is what used to be called the MAX or DAX program? We occasionally get asked if MAX or DAX are no longer operating, and the answer is we are, we just had a name change in the Fall of 2019. This name change came when we expanded our financial assistance program to include Piatt, Moultrie, and Shelby Counties. We continue to offer assistance to those experiencing financial hardship one time per 365 days. We don't give cash to anyone, but instead we send a check direct to the vendor. i.e. Ameren or the water department. We can assist with a maximum of \$300, based on the status of our funds. The funding for this program, not including the Warm Neighbors Cool Friends Program, is funded by donations. Those donations come from both churches and individuals.

Our funding has dwindled as we have assisted numerous people experiencing a hardship! Most of the requests we receive are for help with a power bill. We are able to log in to the Ameren portal to see what options might be available to the applicant and work as best as we can to assist them. When we see a donation come in to DFA, no matter the amount, we are ecstatic as it means we can assist that many more people! If you are able to give, please consider donating to DFA. If you aren't able to, please consider sharing with others that might be able to contribute. As always, one of the best things you can do for our program is to pray; both for the success of the program but also for the applicants we are assisting!

Last month I shared that I had joined the Fall class of the Decatur Leadership Institute. Since then, I've gotten to go to Fire Station #2, a training station, and put on all the fire gear and go into a building with an actual fire! I was also able to use the jaws of life on a test car, which was not easy, and utilize a thermal imaging system in a completely dark building. It was amazing to see a small glimpse of what the Firefighters do for our community on a daily basis. I had always had a high appreciation for their work and commitment, but after the small experience there, I have an even higher appreciation! I also got to experience the Arts and Culture in Macon County by getting a tour of the Decatur Area Arts Council as well as Millikin University's theater program. If you haven't checked out all that the Arts Council has available, I would highly recommend you do so, as they have so much to offer the community!

News from Homeward Bound

The staff has been working to engage and house 99 individuals who have been literally homeless (in a shelter, on the streets, or somewhere unfit for human occupancy, such as an abandoned building) for 90 days or more. One of those individuals meets the chronically homeless criteria, which means they have a diagnosable disability and have been homeless for at least 1 year or have been homeless 4 times in the past 3 years, totaling 365 days.

Public Signups for Families!

Last year we opened sign ups for toy assistance up by internet/email, but it wasn't as successful or problem free as we had hoped it would be. So, this year we are going to be doing TEN public signups for toy assistance (without food baskets).

If you know someone who may need assistance with Christmas gifts for their kids this year, please let them know the following information:

They must have guardianship of their kids and the kids be living in their household. Parents/guardians will need to bring some sort of photo ID (doesn't have to be a driver's license), as well as proof the kids are in the home. This could be a letter from an agency/school verifying the names of the children in the household, could be a court document stating the person has guardianship (this is most likely in the case of foster parents), could be medical cards for the children, social security cards, a recent hospital or doctor's bill with the children's names on it, or a printout/screenshot of the Student Demographic/ Profile report from the school. Children must be between the ages of 0 and 17.

If they have already received a referral from their child's school, an agency they're working with, signed up at Northeast Community Fund or Salvation Army, they do not need to sign up again. In order to assist as many as we can, we will only assist each family one time. Here are the sign up dates and Decatur locations:
