Letter from the Executive Director of Dove, Inc.: Coordinating Efforts to Address Unmet Needs and Social Injustices. Christine Gregory, Executive Director

Dear Friends,

It is with great joy that we share during Domestic Violence Awareness month two incredible donations and our plan going forward to be certain that the needs of victims of domestic violence are being met in our community. As you likely know from the news, the Domestic Violence Program at Dove, Inc. was in dire straits at the end of last fiscal year. Due to a generous donation from the James Millikin Estate to cover part of Shelter staff salaries we were able to proceed into FY18 without additional staff and service cuts. Then a further generous donation from the Howard G. Buffet Foundation for the Domestic Violence Program has positioned us to plan for how we can look at our overall funding structure as we move forward in this next era of budgeting.

One of our strong desires in this situation is to be good stewards of the work which the Lord has given us to do. While the generous donations just mentioned carry us through the current financial situation, we hope to build local funds in a structure which enables us to decrease our state dependence and continue our Domestic Violence ministry and all of Dove's ministries into the future. As you plan your stewardship this fall and for the coming year we hope that you will join us in this effort by continuing to donate as individuals and as churches. With those donations Dove hopes to replenish our reserves, potentially develop an endowment, and ensure that our mission to coordinate efforts to address unmet needs and social injustices is met.

This fall you will see our ministries moving forward as we congratulate all of our Recognition of Service Excellence (ROSE) award winners and all who serve in RSVP, our local SeniorCorps. Program, move into the schools to promote positive choices with our Healthy Relationships and BABES programs, with Domestic Violence Candlelighting Ceremonies in each county we serve, Coats for Kids, and National Hunger and Homelessness Awareness activities such as Box City and the Allegiance Concert in November. After Thanksgiving, we will celebrate our neighborhoods with the Heritage and Holly Historic Home Tour and support local needs with the Christmas Basket Project, Dove's longest running ministry in cooperation with Northeast Community Fund.

All of these efforts would not be possible without the help of countless volunteers and local community support. You make Dove what it is, and we are glad to be a part of your ministry to the world. TEWS from the Domestic Violence Program

As we come upon October, National Domestic Violence Awareness Month, I would like to ask each of you to consider in your own mind "What do I personally understand about domestic violence – or do I?" Do you know what causes it? Drugs/alcohol? Stress? Upbringing? Anger? Did you know that emotional and verbal abuse can hurt just as deeply as physical abuse? Do you understand that domestic violence is very closely related to animal abuse? There are so many questions – but such a lack of understanding, or out and out blame and denial.

Domestic violence is a crime and happens almost every day in our community. Every 9 seconds a woman is beaten – but men also are sometimes victims of domestic violence. The effect domestic violence has on children who are exposed to this environment affects them for the rest of their lives. 60% of children in severely emotionally disturbed classes are from violent homes.

Domestic violence is found in families of all religious backgrounds. Many victims find themselves torn between their religious teachings and their own safety. Rather than leave, they pray for their partners/abusers to change or for the ability to endure the abuse. I encourage all clergy and religious leaders to educate their congregations, create a safe environment for domestic violence victims, and learn how to effectively respond to their needs. Abusive behavior is a choice; it is a learned behavior and knows no boundaries, regardless of race, religious, economic or geographic location.

Please plan to attend our annual Candlelighting Ceremony on Thursday, October 12, 7:00 p.m., at First United Methodist Church, 201 W. North Street. Come be a part of and support victims of domestic violence and the survivors, and to help us recognize all those who work tirelessly every day to held put an end to this unjustifiable crime. Help us fill every single pew in the church and take a stand against domestic violence in our community.


